Mr. Lange moved to approve the minutes of the Supervisors' Meeting and Work Session held February 13, 2012. Mr. Shoemaker seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Shoemaker moved to approve the Lists of Checks and Interfund Transfers dated February 27, 2012. Mr. Lange seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Lange moved to appoint Hanna, McGlone & Co. to replace the elected auditors for the 2011 audit. Mr. Shoemaker seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Lange moved to appoint Bradley J. Billet, Esquire to fill a vacancy on the Historical Commission. Mr. Shoemaker seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion passed unanimously.

Citizens' Comments

Ms. Catherine Malan, 6 Clover Lane, commented on historical and ongoing stormwater runoff from neighboring properties. Ms. Malan indicated that, although the situation had improved, it has not been completely resolved. Ms. Malan referenced an old plan, developed by Yerkes Associates, which was not implemented. Mr. Shoemaker asked Mr. Burman to search for the plan.

Ms. Kathleen Reutter, 101 Fairview Road, commented on the proposed Paoli Transit project and expressed concerns about traffic. Mr. Shoemaker reported that, should the project proceed, the Board of Supervisors has always insisted that roadwork improvements be completed before any other part of the project. Ms. Reutter also complained about sinkholes along Paoli Pike in the vicinity of Fairview Road. Mr. Shoemaker asked Mr. Burman to check with PennDOT.
