

**WILLISTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
688 SUGARTOWN ROAD, MALVERN, PA
TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 11, 2019 AT 7:00 PM**

The Regular Meeting of the Willistown Township Board of Supervisors came to order at 7:00 PM. Supervisors Robert T. Lange, William R. Shoemaker, and Barbara L. Handelin were present. Also present were Township Manager David R. Burman, Chief John M. Narcise, Lieutenant Robert P. Klinger and Director of Engineering & Planning Daniel E. Malloy.

Supervisor Lange led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence for military personnel and in memory of Representative John Dingell.

Announcements

Supervisor Lange announced that the Board of Supervisors will meet in Executive Session immediately following this meeting to discuss personnel matters.

New Business

Supervisor Shoemaker moved to approve the Minutes of the Regular Meeting held January 22, 2019. Supervisor Handelin seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion carried by a vote of 3-0.

Supervisor Shoemaker moved to approve the list of expenditures and interfund transfers dated February 11, 2019. Supervisor Handelin seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion carried by a vote of 3-0.

Supervisor Shoemaker moved to appoint Elizabeth Jekot as Willistown's Representative to the Malvern Library Board, Supervisor Handelin seconded the motion. There were no comments from the Board or the public, and the motion carried by a vote of 3-0.

Supervisor Shoemaker moved to approve Resolution 5 of 2019, endorsing Landscapes3 the County's Comprehensive Plan. Supervisor Handelin seconded. Mahala Renkey, Mike Kerr, and Tom Renkey discussed the Comprehensive Plan with the Board. There were no further comments from the Board or the public, and the motion carried by a vote of 3-0.

Chief Narcise reported on recent activities of the Willistown Police Department. Among other items, Chief Narcise noted that our officers were involved in an arrest following a DUI hit and run in West Goshen. In addition, the Chief reported that a \$100,000.00 Land Rover had been reported missing from Grubb Road.

Citizen's Comments

Mike Kerr of Stonehenge Lane expressed his dissatisfaction with the emergency repair contract on Long Lane and McKinley Avenue.

Mahala Renkey of Tulp Drive asked Chief Narcise about the status of the "Felony Lane Gang". Chief Narcise reported that the activity can occur in cycles where the individuals are arrested, serve time, and they or others return to the areas later to repeat the crime.

Mike Kerr, asked about Sewage Facilities Planning relating to the proposed development at Troutbeck Farm. Mr. Shoemaker reported that the Developer is in the early stages and no formal plan has been received.
